**FEDERAL EMPLOYERS CAN HELP YOU REPAY YOUR STUDENT LOANS**

Agencies are authorized to help repay up to \$10,000 of a loan per year, up to \$60,000 total per employee.

An employee who receives student loan repayments must commit to remaining in the service of the federal government for at least three years.

In FY 2007, 33 federal agencies provided 6,619 employees with almost \$42 million in student loan repayment.
